Did You Know...?

What You Can Do to Reduce Your Chances of Becoming an Identity Theft Victim?

Keep Your Credit and Financial Information Up-to-Date - Order and review your credit report from all three credit reporting bureaus. If you are denied credit or employment, ask why. Review all credit-related bills and statements carefully, and report any questionable charges.

Guard your Social Security number (SSN) - Never put your number on checks, or use it as a password online.

Check Your Own Paper Trail - Buy a shredder to destroy personal financial documents you discard. Never put outgoing checks, bill payments, or tax documents in your home mailbox.

Pare Down What You Carry - Go through your wallet and think about how much information a thief would obtain if it were



stolen. Don't carry your ATM, debit cards, extra credit cards, or your Social Security card unless you plan to use them.

Beware of Bogus Callers - Avoid giving out any confidential information (account numbers, passwords) over the phone to an unsolicited caller who is stating that they represent your financial institution or similar creditor.

Provided courtesy of Travelers Insurance, be prepared in case the worst happens. Protect yourself with coverage that helps you in the unfortunate event that you do become a victim. Black-Eyed Pea Chowder

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 pound diced bacon
- 1 cup chopped celery
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1 cup chopped green bell pepper
- 1 (15.5 ounce) can black-eyed peas with liquid
- 1 (14.5 ounce) can beef consommé
- 1 (29 ounce) can diced tomatoes

DIRECTIONS:

In a large pot over medium high heat, sauté the bacon until crisp. Set aside the bacon and drain the fat, reserving about 4 tablespoons of the fat in the pot. Add the celery onion and green bell pepper to the pot and sauté in the bacon fat for 10 minutes, or until tender. Add the peas, consommé and stewed tomatoes and allow to heat through, about 15 more minutes. Top with crumbled bacon when serving. Serves 6.
